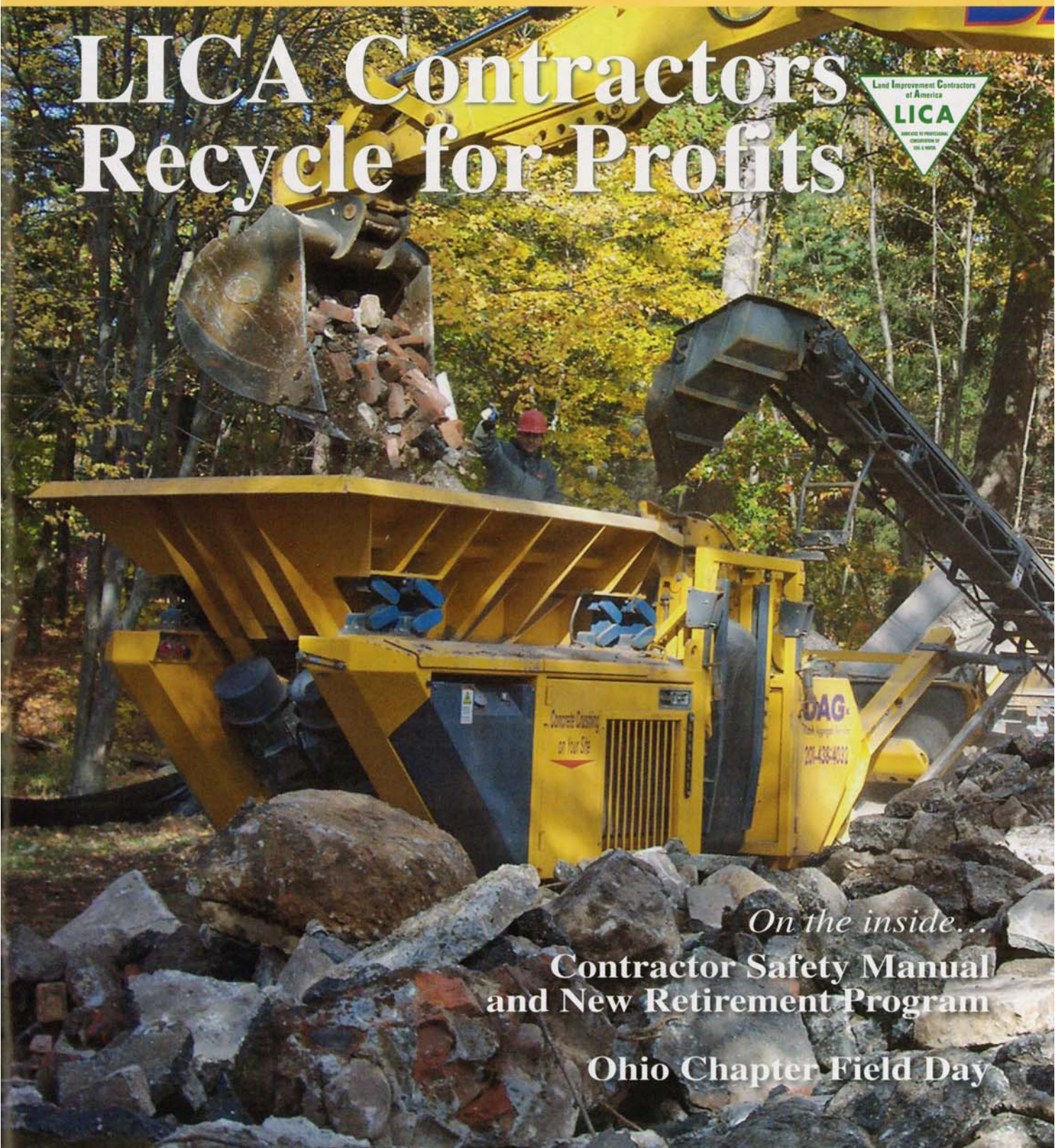

## Joe Mayers Hosts a New Jersey LICA Meeting

Joe Mayers, owner of Mayers Excavating and LICA member, hosted a recent New Jersey LICA meeting. Joe was the feature article in the first LICA Contractor Magazine "A LICA Contractor is Making Waves." He specializes in septic system installation, maintenance and repair of island properties. To deliver this unique service he designed and built a barge with four equal rectangles 8 feet-wide, 15 feet-long and 4 feet deep that fits two-deep, side-by-side, for a maximum 16x30 foot deck.



Joe took New Jersey LICA members for a fun-filled barge ride to an island jobsite. He reviewed the process and method he uses to install new septic systems. The response was overwhelming, the barge was filled to capacity and he has scheduled another barge ride and job-site tour in the spring.
